



## Winter Regatta (NS2) WPNSA 27th/28th February 2016

## The organising authority is WPNSA together with ITCA (GBR)

### 1 RULES

- 1.1 The event will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 The prescriptions of ITCA (GBR) and rules of the host club will also apply.
- 1.3 Competitors should note that ITCA (GBR) implements the RYA Racing Charter and that they will be required to undertake to sail in compliance with the Charter, which can be found at the front of the RYA rule book *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2013 – 2016* or at [www.rya.org.uk/racing/charter](http://www.rya.org.uk/racing/charter).

### 2 ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1 The event is open to all International Topper class dinghies.
- 2.2 There will be separate racing fleets for competitors using 5.3 sails and 4.2 sails.
- 2.3 Every competitor must be a current member of a National Topper Class Association. Competitors that are not already a member of a National Topper Class Association may join ITCA (GBR) at registration, or pay £20 (or £5 if a member of the host club) to become a temporary member of ITCA (GBR) for the duration of the event.
- 2.4 Only the person listed as the competitor on the entry form for a boat shall compete in that boat in the event.

### 3 ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- 3.1 All boats shall comply with the International Topper class rules, in particular only sails and spars supplied by the licensee Topper International shall be used, and sails shall have been officially stamped *Race Approved Sail*.
- 3.2 Each boat shall display the 2016 Championship Number of the competitor sailing the boat (unless otherwise agreed in advance with the Race Committee) in accordance with ITCA (GBR) prescriptions. Each boat trolley shall have a tag attached to the handle clearly displaying the Championship Number of the boat to which it belongs. Competitors that have not already been allocated a 2016 Championship Number will be allocated one at registration. It is the responsibility of the competitor to obtain and fix the Championship Numbers to the sail and boat in accordance with the prescriptions of ITCA (GBR), and to obtain and attach a suitable tag to the handle of the boat's trolley.
- 3.3 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority.
- 3.4 4.2 sails shall not be used in the 5.3 fleet, and 5.3 sails shall not be used in the 4.2 fleet.

### 4 ENTRY

- 4.1 Pre entry is required using the on-line entry system at [www.gbrtopper.co.uk](http://www.gbrtopper.co.uk).
- 4.2 The entry fee is:
  - a. £50 for entries received on or before 14th February 2016
  - b. £65 for entries received thereafter, up to and including 23rd February 2016
  - c. £70 for entries received thereafter. Entries in this case are subject to confirmation by the secretary, and will only be accepted if, in the opinion of the Race Committee, there is adequate safety cover available.
- 4.3 If an entry is cancelled by the competitor their entry fee will be refunded as follows:
  - a. Cancellation up to 2 weeks prior to the event: Entry fee less £5 admin charge, or transfer of entry to another event
  - b. Cancellation within last 2 weeks prior to the event: No refund or transfer of entry to another event.

### 5 REGISTRATION

- 5.1 Registration will be from 08:30 to 10:00 on the first day of the event.
- 5.2 Each competitor shall register before racing. To register, each competitor shall provide a completed entry form and proof of current membership of a National Topper Class Association.

## **6 SCHEDULE**

- 6.1 Racing is scheduled to take place on both days of the event.
- 6.2 The warning signal for the first race on the first day of the event will be no earlier than 10:55.
- 6.3 The warning signal for the first race on the second day is not expected to be before 10:25, but this may change – check SIs and Notices.
- 6.4 On the last day of the event no starting signal will be made after 15:30.
- 6.5 **For the 5.3 fleet:**
  - a. It is likely that the entry will be divided into flights.
  - b. Each flight will sail in up to ten races over the two days of the event.
  - c. Races on each day will normally be back-to-back, with no opportunity to return to shore between races. The intention is that competitors are afloat for no longer than 6 hours on each day without a break ashore.
- 6.6 **For the 4.2 fleet:**
  - a. Up to ten races will be sailed over the two days of the event.
  - b. The intended schedule of racing and of any breaks ashore will be announced at the briefing for 4.2 fleet competitors before racing each day.

## **7 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

- 7.1 Sailing Instructions will be published on the ITCA (GBR) website prior to the event, and will be displayed on the Official Notice Board at the event.

## **8 RACING AREAS**

- 8.1 Racing will be in Portland Harbour.

## **9 THE COURSES**

- 9.1 The 5.3 fleet will sail inner and outer loop trapezoid courses as specified in the Sailing Instructions.
- 9.2 The courses to be sailed by the 4.2 fleet will be specified in the Sailing Instructions.

## **10 PENALTY SYSTEM**

- 10.1 The Exoneration Penalty and RYA Arbitration of the RYA Rules Disputes Procedures will be available.

## **11 SCORING**

- 11.1 The Low Point System of Appendix A will apply, as amended by the Sailing Instructions.
- 11.2 Race scores will be excluded as follows:
  - a. When three or fewer races have been completed, no race score will be excluded.
  - b. When four to eight races have been completed, one race score will be excluded.
  - c. When nine or more races have been completed, two race scores will be excluded.

## **12 PRIZES**

- 12.1 Prizes will be awarded at the conclusion of the event at the discretion of ITCA (GBR), the host club and the event sponsor(s).

## **13 SUPPORT BOATS**

- 13.1 Only support boats registered with the Event Safety Officer will be permitted on the race course.

## **14 RISK STATEMENT**

- 14.1 **Rule 4 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or continue racing is hers alone."**

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

  - a. They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
  - b. They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
  - c. They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omission;

- d. Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- e. The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organisers does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- f. The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.

## **15 INSURANCE**

- 15.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £ 3,000,000 per incident or equivalent.
